

MISSION STATEMENT OF THE SEVENTH-DAY ADVENTIST CHURCH

Our Mission—Make disciples of Jesus Christ who live as His loving witnesses and proclaim to all people the everlasting gospel of the Three Angels' Messages in preparation for His soon return (Matt 28:18-20, Acts 1:8, Rev 14:6-12).

Our Method— Guided by the Bible and the Holy Spirit, Seventh-day Adventists pursue this mission through Christ-like living, communicating, discipling, teaching, healing, and serving.

Our Vision— In harmony with Bible revelation, Seventh-day Adventists see as the climax of God's plan the restoration of all His creation to full harmony with His perfect will and righteousness.

E 85 Conflict of Interest and/or Commitment

E 85 05 Conflict of Interest and/or Commitment Defined—Conflict of interest shall mean any circumstance under which an employee or volunteer by virtue of financial or other personal interest, present or potential, directly or indirectly, may be influenced or appear to be influenced by any motive or desire for personal advantage, tangible or intangible, other than the success and wellbeing of the denomination.

Because of the common objectives embraced by the various organizational units and institutions of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, membership held concurrently on more than one denominational committee or board does not of itself constitute a conflict of interest provided that all the other requirements of the policy are met.

A conflict of commitment shall mean any situation which interferes with an employee's ability to carry out his/her duties effectively. Elected, appointed, or salaried employees on full-time assignment are compensated for full-time employment; therefore, outside or dual employment or other activity, whether compensated or not, that in any way interferes with the performance of an employee's duties and responsibilities is a conflict of commitment. A conflict of commitment also exists in situations where an employee functions contrary to the values and ethical conduct outlined in the organization's statement of ethical foundations and conduct (see model Statement of Ethical Foundations recommended by the 1999 Annual Council as guidelines for divisions) or when an employee functions contrary to established codes of ethical conduct for employees in particular professions (e.g. legal, investments).

E 85 10 Individuals Included Under this Policy—All trustees, officers, executive committee/board members, employees, and volunteers of denominational organizations shall be subject to this policy.

E 85 15 Conditions Constituting Conflict—A trustee, officer, executive committee/board member, employee, or volunteer has a duty to be free from the influence of any conflicting interest or commitment when serving the organization or representing it in negotiations or dealings with third parties. Both while on and off the job an employee is expected to protect the best interests of the employing organization. The following list, though not exhaustive, describes circumstances and conditions that illustrate conflict of interest or commitment:

- 1. Engaging in outside business or employment that encroaches on the denominational organization's call for the full services of its employees even though there may be no other conflict.
- 2. Engaging in business or employment that is in any way competitive or in conflict with any transaction, activity, policy, or objective of the organization.
- 3. Engaging in any business with or employment by an employer who is a supplier of goods or services to any denominational organization.
- 4. Making use of the fact of employment by the denominational organization to further outside business or employment, associating the denominational organization or its prestige with an outside business or employment, or using one's connection to the denomination to further personal or partisan political interests.
- 5. Owning or leasing any property with knowledge that the denominational organization has an active or potential interest therein.
- 6. Lending money to or borrowing money from any third party, excluding financial institutions, who is a supplier of goods or services or lending to/borrowing from a trustor or anyone who is in any fiduciary relationship to the denominational organization or is otherwise regularly involved in business transactions with the denominational organization.
- 7. Accepting or offering of any gratuity, favor, benefit, or gift of greater than nominal value or of any commission or payment of any sort in connection with work for the denominational organization other than the compensation agreed upon between the denominational organization and/or the employer and the employee.

- 8. Making use of or disseminating, including by electronic means, any confidential information acquired through employment by the denominational organization for personal profit or advantage, directly or indirectly.
- 9. Using denominational personnel, property, equipment, supplies, or goodwill for other than approved activities, programs, and purposes.
- 10. Expending unreasonable time, during normal business hours, for personal affairs or for other organizations, to the detriment of work performance for the denomination.
- 11. Using one's connections within the organization to secure favors for one's family or relatives. **E 85 20 Statement of Acceptance**—1. *By Employees*—At the time of initial employment an employee shall sign a statement indicating acceptance of the conditions of employment as outlined in the organization's employee handbook. This acceptance shall constitute the employee's declaration of compliance and resolve to remain in compliance with the conflict of interest and/or commitment policy. On an annual basis the employer shall provide employees with a copy of the Statement of Ethical Foundations, plus a copy of the conflict of interest and/or commitment policy, and shall inform employees regarding the duty to disclose potential conflicts of interest and/or commitment.
- 2. By Administrators, Department Directors and Trustees—The chief administrator, or designee, of the organization concerned shall receive annually a statement of acceptance and compliance with the policy on conflict of interest and/or commitment from each administrator, department director, member of the board/executive committee, and any other person authorized to handle resources of the organization. (The employing organization may determine that other individuals shall also be required to submit annually a statement of acceptance and compliance.) Submission of the statement by persons identified above shall constitute a declaration of compliance with the policy and shall place the individual under obligation to disclose potential conflicts of interest and/or commitment that may arise during the ensuing year.
- **E 85 25 Reporting Potential or Actual Conflicts of Interest or Commitment**—All present and potential conflicts of interest must be disclosed:
- 1. If known, in advance of any meeting, business transaction, or other activity at which the issue may be discussed or on which the issue may have a bearing on the person's approach to the issue, whether directly or indirectly; or
- 2. If not known in advance, when the actual, possible, or potential conflict becomes apparent. Disclosure must be made to the person in charge of the meeting or activity and to the full meeting, or to the person's supervisor, as appropriate. The person should remove himself/herself from the room or situation to avoid participation in all discussion or deliberation on the issue, and voting. All such actions should be recorded in any minutes or records kept. Following full disclosure of the present or potential conflict, the board or equivalent group may decide that no conflict of interest exists and invite the participation of the person.

This policy establishes a process which is self-identifying. However, third parties may report alleged conflicts in writing with supporting documentation, to an officer of the organization concerned if the employee fails to disclose a conflict or does so inadequately. The source of third party reports shall be held in confidence by the recipient unless it is required to divulge the information pursuant to a court order or if there is indication that the report is fraudulent or made with malicious intent.

Back to the Altar seeks to safeguard the spiritual lives of members and others from the negative effects of digital media by promoting good digital hygiene and sharing healthy ways to use media for fellowship and evangelism.

BIBLICAL GUIDANCE

"One lamb you shall offer in the morning, and the other lamb you shall offer at twilight" (Exod 29:39).

OVERVIEW

In the powerful biblical narrative of Elijah's triumph on Mt. Carmel, a wonderful, hidden gem is often overlooked in our rush to see the fire fall and the sacrifice consumed. First Kings 18:36 says that it was "at the time of the evening sacrifice" that Elijah prayed for the fire to fall from heaven, that God might demonstrate He was Israel's God—the only true and living God. It is a telling fact that Elijah waited until the time of the evening sacrifice—allowing the prophets of Baal to wail all day while mutilating themselves—to rebuild Israel's broken altar and seek God's favor again.

This was no coincidence. Morning and evening worship experiences were to be the spiritual bookends of Israelite life. It was God who had instituted this twice daily worship experience to develop a devotional cadence in the lives of His people, as Exodus 29:39 makes clear: "One lamb you shall offer in the morning, and the other lamb you shall offer at twilight." In a very real sense, Elijah was not just calling the nation—individuals and families—back to the altar of true worship; He was calling the nation back to the altar of regular, daily, systematic worship of the true God! Israel's corporate worship altar was broken, but Israel's personal and family altars were broken long before.

We Have a Problem

It is the conviction of the Back to the Altar (BTTA) committee that the Seventh-day Adventist Church is facing a similar crisis in the area of personal and family worship. Too many of our altars are neglected, broken, or non-existent. A 2018 worldwide survey of Seventh-day Adventists found that only 34 percent of Adventist homes are engaging in regular morning and evening worship, and only 52 percent of church members have any personal devotions at all. Can a church with an end-time message centered in worship—the Three Angels' Messages of Revelation 14:6-12—deliver such a solemn message if its members are not faithfully engaged in personal and family worship? In other words, can we proclaim effectively what many do not practice daily?

On the critical importance of devotional time spent with God, Ellen G White wrote the following: "There is nothing more needed in the work of God than the practical results of communion with God." She writes in another place that "no words can properly set forth the blessedness of genuine worship." Authentic worship experiences should neither be fragmentary nor intermittent, especially in the Adventist family: "Like the patriarchs of old, those who profess to love God should erect an altar to the Lord wherever they pitch their tent. . . . Fathers and mothers should often lift up their hearts to God in humble supplication for themselves and their children. Let the father, as priest of the household, lay upon the altar of God the morning and evening sacrifice, while the wife and children unite in prayer and praise. In such a household Jesus will love to tarry."

Our Most Urgent Need

The restoration of personal and family worship among Seventh-day Adventists is the most pressing need of our time but doing so will require much prayer and effort. Today we face the challenge of technologies that, while providing some efficiencies, benefits, and conveniences, increasingly occupy our time while altering our minds. Widespread addiction to devices and media, especially social media, has left too many of us anxious, irritable, lonely, stressed, depressed, sleepless, and unhappy with our station in life.

Ironically, personal and family worship has the opposite effect. It calms our minds, decreases loneliness, reduces stress, increases peace, fulfills our emotional needs, and teaches us contentment. The Back to the Altar initiative seeks to educate members and others about the negative effects of tech/media addiction and its impact on the spiritual life and well-being. The goal is also to share best practices for safeguarding mental, physical, social, emotional, and spiritual health in order to empower our walk with God and fuel or evangelistic efforts for Him.

Now more than ever, God is calling Seventh-day Adventist individuals and families back to His heart—back to consistent times of refreshing in His presence. It is for this reason that the Seventh-day Adventist Church is launching the Back to the Altar initiative, a movement to encourage daily personal worship in the life of every Seventh-day Adventist for revival, reformation, and outreach. By 2027, we hope to see at least 70 percent of Adventist members engaged in daily morning and evening worship. If we rebuild our broken altars, we will fully reflect God's image and be empowered to finish His work in preparation for the soon return of Jesus.

RATIONALE

During the previous quinquennium, we have witnessed the immense blessing to the Seventh-day Adventist Church of such initiatives as Total Member Involvement (TMI), The *Great Controversy* global distribution project, the revitalized Three Angels' Messages proclamation, and the current I WILL GO Strategic Plan. All of these wonderful programs would be much more effective if the devotional lives of members were faithful and consistent. We cannot take for granted that members are growing spiritually through personal and family worship experiences, and many departments of our Church have been working tirelessly on this issue. We thank God for them. We also wish to express sincere gratitude to General Conference Family Ministries for robust and ongoing efforts to encourage individual and family worship among Seventh-day Adventist members. We believe this issue to be of such critical importance that it must become a priority for all entities of the Church through a sustained, coordinated emphasis.

The BTTA initiative seeks to support and fulfill the following fundamental affirmation of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for spiritual growth noted in the I WILL GO Strategic Plan:

Fundamental Belief 11: Growing in Christ

By His death on the cross Jesus triumphed over the forces of evil. He who subjugated the demonic spirits during His earthly ministry has broken their power and made certain their ultimate doom. Jesus' victory gives us victory over the evil forces that still seek to control us, as we walk with Him in peace, joy, and assurance of His love. Now the Holy Spirit dwells within us and empowers us. Continually committed to Jesus as our Savior and Lord, we are set free from the burden of our past deeds. No longer do we live in the darkness, fear of evil powers, ignorance, and meaninglessness of our former way of life. In this new freedom in Jesus, we are called to grow into the likeness of His character, communing with Him daily in prayer, feeding on His Word, meditating on it and on His providence, singing His praises, gathering together for worship, and participating in the mission of the Church (emphasis added). We are also called to follow Christ's example by compassionately ministering to the physical, mental, social, emotional, and spiritual needs of humanity. As we give ourselves in loving service to those around us and in witnessing to His salvation, His constant presence with us through the Spirit transforms every moment and every task into a spiritual experience. BACK TO THE ALTAR INITIATIVE GOALS

- 1. Seventh-day Adventist Members—Individuals and Families
- a. Initiative Goal: 70 percent of Adventist individuals and families engaging in morning and evening worship daily by 2027. This is the prayer goal for the initiative. BTTA efforts will primarily target Adventist singles and families of all types (i.e. nuclear families, blended families, foster families, single-parent led families, grandparent-led families, etc). The initiative will also seek to reach people everywhere, calling them to a daily devotional walk with God and careful stewardship of their mind, "the capital of the body." We believe this foundational spiritual orientation is critical for personal transformation and evangelism.
- b. Educate church members and others on the effects of media and technology on the human brain and share best practices for protecting the mind and safeguarding the spiritual life. Studies show that today's media-saturated society is having a devastating effect on the human brain. Not only does media occupy much of our time, but uninformed usage is degrading our capacity to know, experience, and worship God. As Ellen White presciently stated many years ago, "It is the mind that worships God and allies us to heavenly beings." It is absolutely essential that the Seventh-day Adventist Church make a concerted effort to educate members and others on this critical issue, and this will be a central focus of the BTTA initiative.
- 2. Church Leaders (leaders at all levels of the Church and affiliated para-church entities):
- a. Encourage leaders serving in all areas and entities of the Seventh-day Adventist Church to engage in personal and family devotions each morning and evening. We must care about the spiritual lives of God's leaders and that of their families and loved ones. We believe it is nonnegotiable that Church leaders show by example that they are committed to building and maintaining their personal and family altars.
- b. Encourage Church leaders to share openly about their personal devotional walk with God—where they are in their altar experience with God and how God is leading, developing, and transforming them. We believe such sharing will have a galvanizing impact on members and others. The BTTA initiative will seek to create opportunities for this kind of sharing so that leaders are seen as people in relationship with God and not simply persons doing ministry for God.

3. Back to the Altar for the World

a. Present what the Seventh-day Adventist Church is doing through the BTTA initiative to religious and secular media around the world to invite others to join the movement. The Revival and Reformation Committee has requested that the BTTA initiative look for opportunities to share what it develops with the world at large. We want people everywhere to benefit from this initiative and be drawn closer to Jesus Christ through a consistent, vibrant devotional experience.

b. Share BTTA resources and content through social media to encourage daily worship and healthy uses of all forms of media and technology. It will be important that a specific suite of resources be developed specifically for those we hope to reach through social media with this essential message.

4. Music

- a. Share the role of music and praise in personal worship. One of the important goals of BTTA is to encourage musical praise and expression in personal devotions and family worship.
- b. Highlight the importance of gratitude in worship, expressed through music and other means of worship. Thankfulness is essential to worship. The heart that worships God acknowledges His love and goodness in good times and in trial. BTTA wishes to encourage this spirit of gratitude through music and more in personal and family worship.
- 5. Resource Creation (All resources will be Adventist Possibility Ministries-compatible). These are some of the resources that BTTA hopes to create and promote to encourage the practice of regular, daily devotions with God.
- a. Adventist Home, Child Guidance Video Series: The objective of this resource project is to capture principles from these excellent volumes and show how they may be applied in today's 21st Century family. Special emphasis will be given to Ellen White's counsel regarding the home circle and worship altar.
- b. *Individual/Family Worship Spots*: These multi-media spots will be designed to give individuals and families worship ideas to develop and strengthen devotional life in the home. These spots will show the many ways in which worship can be simple and meaningful, participatory, and enjoyable. We hope that these worship "teasers" will capture the rich diversity of personal worship experiences for individuals and families. These ideas will be captured in a Worship Ideas Database, an online clearinghouse of devotional tips for individuals and families. Many entities of the Church have developed resources for this purpose. We hope to aggregate them in an easily searchable database for online visitors and seekers.
- c. Global Family Worship Night: Each year General Conference Family Ministries conducts the Family Togetherness Week of Prayer. We hope to partner with Family Ministries to hold a global family worship experience on one night during this life-changing week. We wish to invite all Adventist individuals and families to the altar on that night. The Olivers, our current Family Ministries directors, have expressed support for this idea, and we thank them for their ongoing support of the BTTA initiative.
- d. *Back to the Altar Book*: This resource will set forth the call to rebuild our altars and outline the steps by which an individual or family can go about doing so.
- e. Back to the Altar Weekly Podcast: This weekly podcast will feature stories of people of all backgrounds and ethnicities living in devotion with God. The objective of this resource is to share stories of people's personal walk with God to encourage the

devotional life of others. Additionally, true revival and reformation always seeks ministry opportunities to share how God is working in one's life. The weekly podcast will show how personal worship can become the fuel for evangelism in new and dynamic ways.

- f. Together Family Worship Curriculum: This resource aims to give families a tool that will help them worship together for the period of a year. The content will be developed so that families with toddlers, teens, young adults, or a mix of all, can travel through Scripture together and grow closer as a family. Specific content will be developed for each age-group so that learning is age-appropriate for shared discussion and spiritual discovery.
- g. "Worship Now" App for Individuals: We want to explore a collaboration with the forthcoming young adult devotional app from the Ellen G White Estate to see how we might use this resource to encourage personal daily worship. The White Estate App has received excellent reviews from youth and young adults who have had occasion to see it.
- h. *Individual/Family "Digital Hygiene" Media Guide*: This resource will share best practices for the use of smart devices, social media, and personal technology in general. The objective is to help families protect their hearts and minds so that they can remain healthy, open channels with whom the Holy Spirit can dwell and empower.
- i. Back to the Altar—Family Revival Conference: We can educate and provide resources indefinitely, but there's nothing that can replace an actual personal and corporate experience in the Word and in prayer. Thus, the goal of Back to the Altar—Family Revival Conference is to put actual feet on the messages that we have been sharing through all our resource channels. We will launch a 3-4 day Revival Conference for leaders, laity, and their families to experience personal revival through increased emphasis on private and corporate prayer; vibrant time in the Word with practical study and application; engaging family worship activities; and a revitalized focus on the "I Will Go" mission and witness. This conference would be created so that it can be used as a model/template that can be duplicated worldwide.
- j. *Back to the Altar—Leadership Training*: We would provide sermons, tools, Power Points, and training materials for leaders to implement BTTA across their divisions, unions, conferences, churches, and territories.

Note: These are some of the core resources that we believe will be needed for the BTTA initiative to be effective. Other resources will no doubt be needed as the initiative develops and unfolds.

Picture of A Life Lived at the Altar:

"The Majesty of heaven, while engaged in his earthly ministry, prayed much to his Father. He was frequently bowed all night in prayer. His spirit was often sorrowful as he felt the powers of the darkness of this world, and he left the busy city and the noisy throng, to seek a retired place to make his intercessions. The Mount of Olives was the favorite resort of the Son of God for his devotions. Frequently after the multitude had left him for the retirement of the night, he rested not, though weary with the labors of the day. In the Gospel of John we read, 'And every man went unto his own house. Jesus went unto the Mount of Olives.' [John 7:53; 8:1.] While the city was hushed in silence, and the disciples had returned to their homes to obtain refreshment in sleep, Jesus slept not. His divine pleadings were ascending to his Father from the Mount of Olives that his disciples might be kept from the evil influences which they would daily encounter in the world, and that his own soul might be strengthened and braced for the duties and trials of the coming day. All night, while his followers were sleeping, was their divine Teacher praying. The dew and frost of night fell upon his head bowed in prayer. His example is left for his followers."—GW 106

Unless we become vitally connected with God, we can never resist the unhallowed effects of self-love, self-indulgence, and temptation to sin. We may leave off many bad habits, for the time we may part company with Satan; but without a vital connection with God, through the surrender of ourselves to Him moment by moment, we shall be overcome. Without a personal acquaintance with Christ, and a continual communion, we are at the mercy of the enemy, and shall do his bidding in the end."—DA 324

In the School of the Holy Spirit

"There is not an impulse of our nature, not a faculty of the mind or an inclination of the heart, but needs to be, moment by moment, under the control of the Spirit of God."—PP 421

Parents Lead in Worship:

"Like the patriarchs of old, those who profess to love God should erect an altar to the Lord wherever they pitch their tent.... Fathers and mothers should often lift up their hearts to God in humble supplication for themselves and their children. Let the father, as priest of the household, lay upon the altar of God the morning and evening sacrifice, while the wife and children unite in prayer and praise. In such a household Jesus will love to tarry."—CG 518

Danger of the Neglected Family Altar:

There is no reason why this should not be the most interesting and enjoyable exercise of the home life, and God is dishonored when it is made dry and irksome. Let the seasons of family worship be short and spirited. Do not let your children or any member of your family dread them because of their tediousness or lack of interest. When a long chapter is read and explained and a long prayer offered, this precious service becomes wearisome, and it is a relief when it is over."—CG 521

Citadel of the Mind:

138-22G GOD'S PROMISED GIFT: AN URGENT APPEAL FOR REVIVAL, REFORMATION, DISCIPLESHIP, AND EVANGELISM

The following is a slightly updated version (August 2022 by Mark A Finley) of the document, "God's Promised Gift: An Urgent Appeal for Revival, Reformation, Discipleship, and Evangelism," voted by Annual Council on October 11, 2010.

VOTED, To reaffirm the document "God's Promised Gift: An Urgent Appeal for Revival, Reformation, Discipleship, and Evangelism," which reads as follows:

GOD'S PROMISED GIFT: AN URGENT APPEAL FOR REVIVAL, REFORMATION, DISCIPLESHIP, AND EVANGELISM

God has uniquely called the Seventh-day Adventist Church both to live and proclaim His last-day message of love and truth to the world (Revelation 14:6-12). The challenge of reaching the nearly eight billion people on planet Earth with His end-time message seems impossible. The task is overwhelming. From a human perspective, the rapid fulfillment of Christ's Great Commission anytime soon appears unlikely (Matthew 28:19, 20).

The Church's growth rate is simply not keeping pace with the world's burgeoning population. An honest evaluation of our current evangelistic impact on the world leads to the conclusion that unless there is a dramatic change, we will not complete Heaven's assignment in this generation. Despite our best efforts, on our own, all our plans, strategies, and resources are incapable of finishing God's mission.

Christ's Promise to His New Testament Church

The challenge of taking the gospel to the world is not new. The disciples faced this challenge in the first century. We face it in the twenty-first century. The New Testament church was seemingly confronted with an impossible task. But empowered by the Holy Spirit, the church exploded in growth (Acts 2:41; 4:4; 6:7; 9:31). These early Christians shared their faith everywhere (Acts 5:42).

The grace of God overflowed from their hearts to their families, friends, and work associates. Just a few decades after the Crucifixion, the Apostle Paul could report that the gospel is "preached to every creature under heaven" (Colossians 1:23, NKJV). How was it possible for an obscure group of relatively insignificant believers to impact the world in such a short amount of time? How could so few Christians be used of God to change the world forever?

Christ's Great Commission was accompanied by His great promise. The Savior commanded His disciples "not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4). The Savior promised, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit

has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8, NKJV).

The love of Christ controlled every aspect of the disciples' lives and moved them to a passionate commitment to His service (2 Corinthians 5:14). They sought God for the promised power of the Holy Spirit and knelt before Him in heartfelt confession and earnest repentance. They placed priority on seeking the fullness of Heaven's blessing. They set aside times for prayer and searching the Scriptures. Their petty differences were swallowed up in their all-consuming desire to share Christ's love with everyone they met. They were absorbed in reaching the world with the gospel. Nothing was more important. They recognized that they were powerless to accomplish the mission without the mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

Describing the experience of the disciples, Ellen G White wrote, "Putting away all differences, all desire for the supremacy, they came close together in Christian fellowship. . . Sadness filled their hearts as they thought of how many times they had grieved Him by their slowness of comprehension, their failure to understand the lessons that, for their good, He was trying to teach them. The disciples felt their spiritual need and cried to the Lord for the Holy unction that was to fit them for the work of soul saving. They did not ask for a blessing for themselves merely. They were weighted with the burden of the salvation of souls. They realized that the gospel was to be carried to the world, and they claimed the power that Christ promised" (AA 37).

Christ fulfilled His promise. The Holy Spirit was poured out in Pentecostal power. Thousands were converted in a day. The message of Christ's love impacted the world. In a short time, the name of Jesus Christ was on the lips of men and women everywhere. "By the co-operation of the divine Spirit, the apostles did a work that shook the world. To every nation was the gospel carried in a single generation" (AA 593).

Christ's Promise to His End-Time Church

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost in the early rain was only a prelude of what is to come. God has promised to pour out His Holy Spirit in abundance in the last days (Joel 2:23; Zechariah 10:1). The earth will be "illuminated with his glory" (Revelation 18:1, NKJV). The work of God on earth will be finished rapidly (Matthew 24:14; Romans 9:28). The Church will experience a spiritual revival and the fullness of the Holy Spirit's power like never before in its history. Speaking of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, Peter gives us this assurance: "For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:39, NKJV). Ellen G White adds, "Before the final visitation of God's judgments upon the earth, there will be, among the people of the Lord, such a revival of primitive godliness as has not been witnessed since apostolic times. The Spirit and power of God will be poured out upon His children. At that time many will separate themselves from those churches in which the love of this world has supplanted love for God and His word. Many, both of ministers and people, will gladly accept those great truths which God has caused to be proclaimed at this time to prepare a people for the Lord's second coming" (GC 464).

Hundreds of thousands of people will accept God's last-day message through the teaching and preaching of His Word. Prayer, Bible study, and witness are all elements of true revival. The manifestation of the Holy Spirit will intensify as the end approaches. "Near the close of earth's harvest, a special bestowal of spiritual grace is promised to prepare the church for the coming of the Son of Man" (FLB 333). "By thousands of voices, all over the earth, the warning will be given. Miracles will be wrought, the sick will be healed, and signs and wonders will follow the believers" (GC 612).

There is nothing more important than knowing Jesus, studying His Word, understanding His truth, and seeking His promise for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in latter-rain power for the fulfilling of the gospel commission. God's last-day prophet to the remnant wrote in words too plain to be misunderstood, "A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work" (1SM 121).

If a genuine spiritual revival is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs, should we not as leaders place priority on seeking Heaven's promised blessing with all our hearts?

When we seek Jesus, He fills us with His presence and power through the gift of the Holy Spirit. We long to know Him better. The Holy Spirit reawakens the dormant spiritual faculties of the soul. There is nothing we desire more than to have a deep and life-changing relationship with Jesus. The revived heart experiences a vital connection to Jesus through prayer and the Word. Reformation is the corresponding change that comes in our lives as the result of revival.

"A revival and a reformation must take place under the ministration of the Holy Spirit. Revival and reformation are two different things. Revival signifies a renewal of spiritual life, a quickening of the powers of mind and heart, a resurrection from spiritual death. Reformation signifies a reorganization, a change in ideas and theories, habits and practices. Reformation will not bring forth the good fruit of righteousness unless it is connected with the revival of the Spirit. Revival and reformation are to do their appointed work, and in doing this work they must blend" (1SM 128). Reformation does not manifest itself in a self-righteous attitude that condemns others. It is the transformation of character that reveals the fruits of the Spirit in the life (Galatians 5:22-24). Obedience to God's will is the evidence of all true revival. Our Lord longs for a revived people whose lives reflect the loveliness of His character. There is nothing that Jesus desires more than a people who are passionate about personally knowing His love and sharing that love with others.

Commitment and Appeal

As leaders of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, we give thanks to God for His faithfulness and abundant blessings to His Church since its inception. The rapid worldwide expansion of His Church in both its membership and institutions is nothing short of miraculous. In recent years, we have seen the rapid growth of the Church in a number of countries. Although we praise Him for marvelously working to fulfill His purposes through His Church and thank Him for the godly leaders who have guided His people in the past, we humbly acknowledge that because of our human frailties even our best efforts are tainted by sin and in need of cleansing through the grace of Christ. We recognize that we have not always placed priority on seeking God through prayer and His Word for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in latter-rain power. We humbly confess that in our personal lives, our administrative practices, and committee meetings we too often have labored in our own strength. Too often God's mission of saving a lost world has not taken first place in our hearts. At times in our busyness doing good things, we have neglected the most important thing—knowing Him and sharing His end-time message of eternal truth with others. Too often petty jealousies, ambitions, and fractured personal relationships have crowded out our longing for revival and reformation and caused us to labor in our human strength rather than in His divine power.

We accept the clear instruction of our Lord that "the lapse of time has wrought no change in Christ's parting promise to send the Holy Spirit as His representative. It is not because of any restriction on the part of God that the riches of His grace do not flow earthward to men. If the fulfillment of the promise is not seen as it might be, it is because the promise is not appreciated as it should be. If all were willing, all would be filled with the Spirit" (AA 50).

We are confident that all heaven is waiting to pour out the Holy Spirit in infinite power for the finishing of God's work on earth. We acknowledge that the coming of Jesus has been delayed and that our Lord longed to come decades ago. We sense Christ calling us to a deeper relationship with Him in prayer and Bible study and a more passionate commitment to share His last-day message with the world. We rejoice that "it is the privilege of every Christian, not only to look for, but to hasten the coming of the Saviour" (AA 600).

Therefore, as representatives of the world Church and on behalf of our entire membership, we commit ourselves:

- 1. To personally place priority on seeking God for spiritual revival and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in latter-rain power in our own lives, families, and ministries.
- 2. To individually set aside significant amounts of time daily to fellowship with Christ through prayer and the study of God's Word.
- 3. We desire willing hearts so that nothing in our lives hinders the fullness of the Holy Spirit's power.
- 4. To encourage the ministries of the Church to spend time praying, studying God's Word, and seeking God's heart to understand His plans for His Church.

- 5. To encourage each Seventh-day Adventist organization to set aside time for administrators, pastors, healthcare workers, publishing house workers, educators, students, and all employees to seek Jesus and the promised outpouring of the Holy Spirit together through a study of God's Word and prayer.
- 6. To use every available media outlet, conference, and workshop to appeal to church members to seek a deeper relationship with Jesus for the promised revival and reformation.
- 7. To urgently appeal to and invite our entire church membership to join us in opening our hearts to the life-changing power of the Holy Spirit, which will transform our lives, our families, organizations, and communities.
- 8. To earnestly appeal to each church member to use their God-given gifts of the Spirit in Total Member Involvement (TMI) to reach lost people. We recognize that the Holy Spirit will not be poured out in its fullness on inactivity, so we encourage every member to become actively involved in service for the Master.

We especially recognize that God is going to use children and youth in this last mighty revival and encourage each one of our young people to participate in seeking God for spiritual revival in their own lives and the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to share their faith with others.

We appeal to each church member to unite with church leaders and millions of other Seventh-day Adventists seeking a deeper relationship with Jesus, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the completion of Christ's mission on earth. This is an urgent call to circle the globe with earnest intercession. This is a call to total commitment to Jesus and to experience the life-changing power of the Holy Spirit that our Lord is longing to give now.

We believe that the purpose of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in latter-rain power is to finish Christ's mission on earth so He can come quickly. Recognizing that our Lord will only pour out His Spirit in its fullness on a church that has a passion for lost people, we determine to place and maintain revival, reformation, discipleship, and evangelism at the top of all our church business agendas. More than anything else we long for Jesus to come.

We urge every church administrator, departmental leader, institutional worker, health worker, literature evangelist, chaplain, educator, pastor, and church member to join us in making revival, reformation, discipleship, and evangelism the most important and urgent priorities of our personal lives and our areas of ministry. We are confident that as we seek Him together, God will pour out His Holy Spirit in abundant measure, the work of God on earth will be finished, and Jesus will come. With the aged Apostle John on the Isle of Patmos we cry out, "Even so, come, Lord Jesus" (Revelation 22:20, NKJV).

- c. Board members shall hold office between sessions of No change
- d. Vacancies on the Board <u>or its standing committees (e.g. Committee on Seventh-day Adventist Health Professional Education, Programs Review Committee)</u> shall be filled by the Board for the unexpired term.

- c. To approve the establishment or discontinuance of tertiary level schools and programs, the upgrading of post secondary institutions, the affiliation of schools across division boundaries, and the implementation of interdivision extended campus programs.
- c. To receive and record proposals from division boards of education, authorize evaluations and site visits, receive evaluative reports, authorize recognition and candidacy for substantive change and new programs, and to approve the establishment or record discontinuance of tertiary programs and institutions, and then to recommend the actions to the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and Universities.

- d. To approve the affiliation of schools across division boundaries, or the implementation of interdivision extended campus programs, and then to recommend the actions to the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and Universities.
- $\frac{d}{d}$ e. To develop funding plans for the support of Seventh-day Adventist education.
- <u>f.</u> <u>To coordinate implementation of any approved financial program to assist the school system.</u>
- e. g. To require from division departments of education such reports as will enable the Board to perform its duties and functions.
- f. h. To recommend to the division boards of education general personnel policies for teachers, administrators, and related school staff.
- g. To coordinate implementation of any approved financial program to assist the school system.
- h. i. To review, through recommend to the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and <u>Universities desirable changes in accreditation standards and criteria.</u> Universities, existing programs of instruction, research, and training for denominational service in the schools and advise them regarding desirable change.

FE 20 20 International Board of Ministerial and Theological Education (IBMTE)—1. Education—1. Purpose—The International Board of Ministerial and Theological Education (GCC-B) is the primary vehicle through which General Conference Education is authorized to act in the areas that are indicated in General Conference Working Policy to develop, coordinate, and maintain a comprehensive master plan to prepare pastors, evangelists, theologians, teachers of Bible and religion, and chaplains for Seventh-day Adventist ministry. The IBMTE works in cooperation with the world divisions in providing overall guidance and standards to the professional training that Church-supported institutions offer to pastors, evangelists, theologians, teachers of Bible and religion, chaplains, and other denominational employees involved in ministerial and religious formation. Utilizing existing interconnected institutional boards, policies, standards, and procedures, the board seeks to achieve the following objectives in relation to graduate, undergraduate, and other types of ministerial and theological education:

- a. Foster a dynamic theological unity in the world No change
- b. Sharpen the focus on Seventh-day Adventist message No change
- c. Support the spiritual and professional development No change
- d. Promote professional excellence in ministerial training No change
- e. Nurture strong collaboration between church No change
- f. Energize the spiritual life of Seventh-day Adventist No change

The Commission on Accreditation of each division is responsible for the denominational accreditation of primary schools owned and operated by the Church in its territory. The Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and Universities and the Commissions on Accreditation evaluate the quality of the denominational institutions' programs and their implementation of the Seventh-day Adventist philosophy of education in order to foster the unity and mission of the Church. To be recognized as an official Seventh-day Adventist educational institution, each Seventh-day Adventist educational institution shall seek accreditation from the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and Universities prior to the commencement of operations.

2. Composition of the Accrediting <u>Association—The composition of the Accrediting Association is defined in the bylaws of the Accrediting Association of Seventh-day Adventist Schools, Colleges, and Universities. Chapter 36—The Impending Conflict

From the very beginning of the great controversy in heaven it has been Satan's purpose to overthrow the law of God. It was to accomplish this that he entered upon his rebellion against the Creator, and though he was cast out of heaven he has continued the same warfare upon the earth. To deceive men, and thus lead them to transgress God's law, is the object which he has steadfastly pursued. Whether this be accomplished by casting aside the law altogether, or by rejecting one of its precepts, the result will be ultimately the same. He that offends "in one point," manifests contempt for the whole law; his influence and example are on the side of transgression; he becomes "guilty of all." James 2:10.

In seeking to cast contempt upon the divine statutes, Satan has perverted the doctrines of the Bible, and errors have thus become incorporated into the faith of thousands who profess to believe the Scriptures. The last great conflict between truth and error is but the final struggle of the long-standing controversy concerning the law of God. Upon this battle we are now entering—a battle between the laws of men and the precepts of Jehovah, between the religion of the Bible and the religion of fable and tradition.

The agencies which will unite against truth and righteousness in this contest are now actively at work. God's holy word, which has been handed down to us at such a cost of suffering and blood, is but little valued. The Bible is within the reach of all, but there are few who really accept it as the guide of life. Infidelity prevails to an alarming extent, not in the world merely, but in the church. Many have come to deny doctrines which are the very pillars of the Christian faith. The great facts of creation as presented by the inspired writers, the fall of man, the atonement, and the perpetuity of the law of God, are practically rejected,

either wholly or in part, by a large share of the professedly Christian world. Thousands who pride themselves upon their wisdom and independence regard it as an evidence of weakness to place implicit confidence in the Bible; they think it a proof of superior talent and learning to cavil at the Scriptures and to spiritualize and explain away their most important truths. Many ministers are teaching their people, and many professors and teachers are instructing their students, that the law of God has been changed or abrogated; and those who regard its requirements as still valid, to be literally obeyed, are thought to be deserving only of ridicule or contempt.

In rejecting the truth, men reject its Author. In trampling upon the law of God, they deny the authority of the Law-giver. It is as easy to make an idol of false doctrines and theories as to fashion an idol of wood or stone. By misrepresenting the attributes of God, Satan leads men to conceive of Him in a false character. With many, a philosophical idol is enthroned in the place of Jehovah; while the living God, as He is revealed in His word, in Christ, and in the works of creation, is worshiped by but few. Thousands deify nature while they deny the God of nature. Though in a different form, idolatry exists in the Christian world today as verily as it existed among ancient Israel in the days of Elijah. The god of many professedly wise men, of philosophers, poets, politicians, journalists—the god of polished fashionable circles, of many colleges and universities, even of some theological institutions—is little better than Baal, the sun-god of Phoenicia.

No error accepted by the Christian world strikes more boldly against the authority of Heaven, none is more directly opposed to the dictates of reason, none is more pernicious in its results, than the modern doctrine, so rapidly gaining ground, that God's law is no longer binding upon men. Every nation has its laws, which command respect and obedience; no government could exist without them; and can it be conceived that the Creator of the heavens and the earth has no law to govern the beings He has made? Suppose that prominent ministers were publicly to teach that the statutes which govern their land and protect the rights of its citizens were not obligatory—that they restricted the liberties of the people, and therefore ought not to be obeyed; how long would such men be tolerated in the pulpit? But is it a graver offense to disregard the laws of states and nations than to trample upon those divine precepts which are the foundation of all government?

It would be far more consistent for nations to abolish their statutes, and permit the people to do as they please, than for the Ruler of the universe to annul His law, and leave the world without a standard to condemn the guilty or justify the obedient. Would we know the result

of making void the law of God? The experiment has been tried. Terrible were the scenes enacted in France when atheism became the controlling power. It was then demonstrated to the world that to throw off the restraints which God has imposed is to accept the rule of the cruelest of tyrants. When the standard of righteousness is set aside, the way is open for the prince of evil to establish his power in the earth.

Wherever the divine precepts are rejected, sin ceases to appear sinful or righteousness desirable. Those who refuse to submit to the government of God are wholly unfitted to govern themselves. Through their pernicious teachings the spirit of insubordination is implanted in the hearts of children and youth, who are naturally impatient of control; and a lawless, licentious state of society results. While scoffing at the credulity of those who obey the requirements of God, the multitudes eagerly accept the delusions of Satan. They give the rein to lust and practice the sins which have called down judgments upon the heathen.

Those who teach the people to regard lightly the commandments of God sow disobedience to reap disobedience. Let the restraint imposed by the divine law be wholly cast aside, and human laws would soon be disregarded. Because God forbids dishonest practices, coveting, lying, and defrauding, men are ready to trample upon His statutes as a hindrance to their worldly prosperity; but the results of banishing these precepts would be such as they do not anticipate. If the law were not binding, why should any fear to transgress? Property would no longer be safe. Men would obtain their neighbor's possessions by violence, and the strongest would become richest. Life itself would not be respected. The marriage vow would no longer stand as a sacred bulwark to protect the family. He who had the power, would, if he desired, take his neighbor's wife by violence. The fifth commandment would be set aside with the fourth. Children would not shrink from taking the life of their parents if by so doing they could obtain the desire of their corrupt hearts. The civilized world would become a horde of robbers and assassins; and peace, rest, and happiness would be banished from the earth.

Already the doctrine that men are released from obedience to God's requirements has weakened the force of moral obligation and opened the floodgates of iniquity upon the world. Lawlessness, dissipation, and corruption are sweeping in upon us like an overwhelming tide. In the family, Satan is at work. His banner waves, even in professedly Christian households. There is envy, evil surmising, hypocrisy, estrangement, emulation, strife, betrayal of sacred trusts, indulgence of lust. The whole system of religious principles and doctrines, which should form the foundation and framework of social life, seems to be

a tottering mass, ready to fall to ruin. The vilest of criminals, when thrown into prison for their offenses, are often made the recipients of gifts and attentions as if they had attained an enviable distinction. Great publicity is given to their character and crimes. The press publishes the revolting details of vice, thus initiating others into the practice of fraud, robbery, and murder; and Satan exults in the success of his hellish schemes. The infatuation of vice, the wanton taking of life, the terrible increase of intemperance and iniquity of every order and degree, should arouse all who fear God, to inquire what can be done to stay the tide of evil.
